## **Born** July 12, 100 BC in Rome **Assassinated** 44 BC

- Politician and military ruler of the Roman Empire, which he grew to control territory throughout Europe & the Middle East.
- Had a relationship with Cleopatra and was considered one of the best Latin orators & prose writers.
- Betrayed by friend Marcus Brutus and assassinated by Roman senators on the "Ides of March."




### Born July 18, 1918 in South Africa Died 2013

- Activist and philanthropist who became South Africa's 1st black President.
- Spent 27 years in prison for opposing pro-apartheid (i.e. racial discriminatory) government.
- Established South Africa's first black law firm.
- Awarded 1993 Nobel Peace Prize for peacefully ending apartheid.

### Born Feb. 12, 1809 in KY Assassinated 1865

- Lawyer, politician, statesman and 16th President of the U.S.
- Led the country through the Civil War and his Gettysburg Address promoted national pride, equal rights and liberty for all.
- Freed slaves through the Emancipation Proclamation, leading to the 13th Amendment to permanently outlaw slavery.

**Born** Sep. 7, 1533 in England **Died** 1603

- Queen of England & Ireland for 45 years and last monarch of the Tudor dynasty.
- Her reign during England's Golden Age is famous for fighting poverty and its thriving drama, art and literature (like Shakespeare).
- Famously defeated the Spanish Armada, uniting England.



Born Aug. 15, 1769 in France Died 1821

- Military and political leader during and after the French Revolution.
- His impressive military strategies are still studied today and his "code" helped modernize France.
- Short in height, he compensated for it with aggressive behavior and his inferiority complex led to a "condition" named after him.

# Born 1270 in Scotland Executed 1305

- Fearless leader during the Wars of Scottish independence from England.
- Appointed Guardian of Scotland until his defeat at the Battle of Falkirk.
- King Edward I of England had him painfully executed for treason & high crimes against the crown.
- Immortalized in literature, poetry and the Academy Award-winning film Braveheart.



**Born** Jan. 6, 1412 in France | **Died** 1431

- French military leader and heroine during 100 Years' War.
- Born a peasant, she heard divine voices instructing her to save France from the English.
- Nicknamed the "Maid of Orléans" for defeating the British there.
- Famously carried banner into battle preferring it over a sword.
- Ultimately captured & burned at the stake, cementing her legacy.

Born Sep. 8, 1157 in England Died 1199

- King of England remembered by his feline nickname rather than his royal number.
- By age 16, he commanded his own army in rebellion against his father.
- As the Central Christian Commander during the Third Crusade, had many victories vs. his Muslim opponent Saladin.
- Shot by crossbowman (a boy whom he forgave and set free), he died when his wound became infected.






**Born** 111 BC in Bulgaria **Died** 71 BC

- Thracian gladiator who led the slave rebellion against Roman oppression.
- Captured and sold as a slave himself, he escaped from gladiator school and led slave insurrections during the Third Servile War.
- Perished in an attack by Marcus Crassus and his 50,000 soldiers.

When a free man dies, he loses the pleasure of life... Death is the only freedom a slave knows.



Born 356 BC in Greece | Died 323 BC

- Ancient King of Macedonia.
- Conquered kingdoms of Egypt, Persia & India, always bravely fighting on the front lines.
- Aristotle was his tutor, teaching him the works of Homer which he would later carry into war.
- Undefeated in battle for 15 years, his tactics are still taught in military schools today.



## **Born** 4 BC in Bethlehem **Died** 30 AD


- Jewish carpenter considered the most famous man who ever lived.
- Baptised by John the Baptist, his followers started Christianity.
- 4 Gospels in the Bible give an account of his birth, life, death by crucifixion & resurrection.
- Spent his later life healing the sick, performing miracles and spreading the word of God.



### Born 551 BC ancient China | Died 479 BC

- Wise Chinese teacher, editor, politician, judge & philosopher known as "Kung Fu-tzu."
- Said leaders should be role models & taught strong family values of loyalty & respect.
- Has longest-known family tree in the world, with more than 3 million descendants!
- Was 1st to express the principle known as the Golden Rule:
- Do not do to others what you do not want done to yourself.






## Born around 563 BC in Nepal Died 483 BC

- Founded the world's 4th largest religion based on 3 tenets: don't get angry, hate others or be ignorant.
- Born a prince, he sought wisdom and knowledge and understood material wealth was not life's ultimate goal.
- Practiced moderation and spread teachings by nonviolent methods like word of mouth & carvings.

Three things cannot be long hidden: the sun, the moon, and the truth.



Born 1391 BC in Egypt Died 1271 BC


- Most important prophet in Judaism, but also important in Christianity, Islam & others.
- Rescued from a basket and adopted by a Pharaoh's daughter.
- The written Jewish law, or Torah, is generally attributed to him.
- Parted the Red Sea while leading the Israelites out of slavery.
- Received Ten Commandments from God, listing religious, moral & social principles to follow.



**Born** 428 or 424 BC in Greece **Died** 348 BC

- Greek philosopher regarded a founder of Western religion & spirituality.
- Famous student of Socrates and famous teacher of Aristotle.
- His teachings covered religion, science, medicine and human nature.
- His famous work The Republic shares his ideas on wisdom, courage, justice & living life in moderation.

Born July 24, 1897 in KS Disappeared July 2, 1937

- American aviator & 1st woman to fly solo across the Atlantic.
- Wrote 20 Hrs., 40 Min. & The Fun of It about her experiences flying.
- The "Queen of Air" used her celebrity to inspire others and push for equal rights for women.



Born Jul. 20, 1919 in New Zealand Died 2008

- Along with Sherpa Tenzing Norgay, he was the 1st to summit Mt. Everest, the tallest mountain in the world.
- Also led an expedition to the South Pole and flew a small plane to the North Pole with U.S. astronaut Neil Armstrong!
- Was 1st living Kiwi to appear on a New Zealand bank note.

Motivation is the single most important factor in any sort of success.




Born 1480 in Portugal | Died 1521

- 1st explorer to lead an expedition to circumnavigate the globe.
- Set sail with 5 ships to find a western route to the Spice Islands but he died during the voyage and 3 years later only 1 ship returned home.
- 1st European to cross Pacific Ocean, naming it "Mar Pacifico" (Portuguese for Peaceful Sea).






Born Apr. 3, 1934 in England

- British primatologist, anthropologist & United Nations Messenger of Peace.
- Fascinated with animals after receiving a life-like stuffed chimpanzee from her father.
- Observing chimps in Africa, she made landmark discoveries that they used tools (like humans) & were omnivores.
- Awarded Kyoto, Hubbard & Tyler Awards for her achievements.



- American brothers credited with inventing & successfully flying the world's 1st airplane.

- Neil Armstrong carried part of their plane - the "1903 Flyer" - to the moon in 1969!



## Born Jan. 4, 1643 in England Died 1727

- English physicist, mathematician, astronomer, inventor & teacher.

- Secretly an alchemist (one who can turn base metal into gold) who also invented the reflecting telescope.
- Knighted in 1704, becoming "Sir."






Born 384 BC in Macedonia | Died 322 BC

- Brilliant Greek scientist and philosopher who Dante said was "the master of those who know."
- Studied under Plato and tutored Alexander the Great.
- Wrote Nicomachus Ethics to honor his son who died in battle.
- Considered history's 1st true scientist for his research, observation and testing in biology, chemistry, zoology, physics, geology & astronomy.



Born 460 BC in Ancient Greece Died 370 BC

- Greek physician known as the "Father of Medicine."
- 1st to separate medicine from superstition and express belief that ideas come from our brains (not our hearts), a revolutionary concept at the time.
- 1st known chest surgeon whose research is still valid today.
- His "oath" is based on his principles & still guides the ethical conduct of physicians today.



**Born** April 15, 1452 in Italy | **Died** 1519

- This "Renaissance Man" had talents ranging from music to math, science to sculpting and architecture to anatomy.
- Credited with inventing the parachute, tank & helicopter.
- He loved animals and questioned the morality of eating meat.
- Painted the famous Mona Lisa and The Last Supper, and his "Vitruvian Man" shows incredibly accurate human proportions.

**Born** March 3, 1847 in Scotland **Died** 1922


- Scottish scientist & engineer credited with inventing the telephone.
- Talented piano player whose mother & wife were deaf, which greatly influenced his career.
- Also invented the metal detector and the audiometer (for detecting hearing problems).

A man, as a general rule, owes very little to what he is born with a man is what he makes of himself.




**Born** Dec. 5, 1901 in IL **Died** 1966

- Imaginative American inventor, entrepreneur, cartoonist and movie producer.

- Expanded into theme parks and merchandising, creating one of the world's largest entertainment companies.

Born Jan. 28, 1940 in Mexico


- Business mogul, investor and philanthropist once ranked as the richest person in world.
- The son of Lebanese immigrants, he formed one of Mexico's largest conglomerates before he turned 30 years old.

Born Jan. 29, 1954 in MS

- Won Presidential Medal of Freedom and the 1st African American woman to win the Cecil B. DeMille award.
- Surround yourself with only people who are going to lift you higher.






**Born** July 30, 1863 in MI | **Died** 1947

- Inventor & industrialist who revolutionized the transportation & manufacturing industries.
- He created the assembly line for mass producing and selling his affordable Model T car.
- Promoted his company by paying workers double that of his competitors and sponsored car racing despite his distaste for it.

### **Born** July 31, 1965 in UK

- Novelist, film producer, screenwriter & philanthropist & 1st person to ever become a billionaire by writing books.
- Before becoming famous, struggled with her mum's death, divorce and feelings of failure.
- Wrote Harry Potter series, which has sold over 400 million copies and counting!



**Born** c.800 BCE, Ancient Greece **Died** c. 700 BCE

- Mysterious, epic poet famous for The Iliad & The Odyssey.
- Little is known about him but it's thought he may have been blind.
- The poems were "composed" by speaking or singing and weren't written down until much later. Both classics were influential in the development of Western culture, education & Christianity.

Born Dec. 1770 in Germany | Died 1827

- Deaf musician considered the greatest composer in history.
- Abused as a child, he grew up shy, angry and lonely...
- ...but brilliantly composed symphonies, sonatas & operas, many after he lost his hearing!
- Was a perfectionist who ended performances if anyone was talking or unattentive.



- Honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

**Born** March 25, 1942 in TN | **Died** 2018

- Songwriter, musician & singer and 1st female inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.
- "The Queen of Soul" began singing gospel at her father's church and went on to commercial success with 20 #1 R&B singles & 18 Grammy Awards.
- She also sang at 3 Presidential inaugurations!
- One of her biggest hits, "Respect" became a strong anthem for the civil rights & feminist movements.



**Born** Aug. 4, 1901 in LA | **Died** 1971

 Trumpet player, scat singer & one of the most influential people in the history of jazz.

 Recorded 19 Top 10 albums, including What a Wonderful World & When The Saints Go Marching In.

- Nicknamed "Pops" for his giant personality, he also acted in film, often playing himself.
- Posthumously awarded Lifetime Achievement Grammy.

Musicians don't retire; they stop when there's no more music in them.

**Born** January 8, 1935 in MS | **Died** 1977

- Singer & actor simply called "The King," he ushered in the rock & roll musical era.
- Recorded 600+ songs, but didn't actually write any of them!
- His 1st single, "Heartbreak Hotel," reached #1 and he has more #1 albums than any other solo artist.
- Served in the Army for 2 years and also starred in over 30 movies!


Ambition is a dream with a V8 engine.



Born Jan. 31, 1919 in GA | Died 1972

- 1st African American to play Major League Baseball, breaking the "color barrier" with the Brooklyn Dodgers.
- Withstood verbal & physical abuse to prove racial integration in baseball was bigger than himself.
- 1st black Baseball Hall of Famer & his #42 was retired by all teams.
- Key figure in the civil rights movement and awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

A life is not important except in the impact it has on other lives.



**Born** June 11, 1913 in NYC **Died** 1970

- Football player, coach & executive in the National Football League.
- Led Green Bay Packers to 3 straight (and 5 total) NFL Championships.
- Had zero tolerance for racism, viewing players as "neither black nor white, but Packer green."
- In NFL Hall of Fame and league's Super Bowl trophy is named after him.

- Won Olympic gold in 1960 and was heavyweight champ 3 times.
- Outspoken civil rights activist who refused U.S. military service and was arrested, found guilty & stripped of his titles

Born Nov. 12, 1961 in Romania

- Inducted into International Gymnastics Hall of Fame.




Born Oct. 23, 1940 in Brazil


### Born Jan. 15, 1929 in GA Assassinated 1968

- Reverend known as the most prominent leader of the U.S. civil rights movement.
- Led the Montgomery Bus Boycott in support of Rosa Parks.
- Organized Washington D.C. march and delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech.
- Awarded Nobel Peace Prize, Presidential Medal of Freedom & Congressional Gold Medal.
- Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter.

### Born October 2, 1869 in India Assassinated 1948

- Lawyer and politician who led movement against British rule.
- Used nonviolent political civil disobedience, inspiring civil rights & freedom movements around the world.
- Helped reduce poverty, improve women's rights and promote religious & ethnic harmony, even fasting to near death to achieve his goals.
- You must be the change you want to see in the world.



**Born** Apr. 28, 1908 in Czech Rep. **Died** 1974

- German businessman and Nazi Party member credited with saving 1,200 Jews during the Holocaust.
- Employed them as "essential workers" at his factory and kept a gold ring with the inscription "Whoever saves one life saves the world entire."
- Buried in Jerusalem on Mount Zion.
- I did what I could, what I had to do, what my conscience told me I must do... Really, nothing more.





WHO AM I?

**Born** May 12, 1820 in Italy **Died** 1910

- English social reformer & founder of modern nursing.
- Known as "The Lady with the Lamp," she managed & trained nurses to care for wounded soldiers during the Crimean War.
- Had laws enacted to force buildings to properly and safely dispose of sewage, which increased Britain's life expectancy by 20 years!

**Born** Nov. 8, 1897 NYC | **Died** 1980

- Journalist & social activist committed to caring for vulnerable people in need.
- Outspoken & critical about how society idolizes wealth.
- Member of Alice Paul's nonviolent "Silent Sentinels" and imprisoned for civil disobedience.
- Co-founded Catholic Worker newspaper and served as editor for 47 years!

66 We must talk about poverty, because people insulated by their own comfort lose sight of it.

# GEORGE WASHINGTON

Born Feb. 22, 1732 in Virginia Died 1799

- Founding Father, Revolutionary War General and 1st President of the United States.
- Commander-in-chief of the colonial army against British rule.
- Awarded Congressional Gold Medal and honored on the \$1 bill and on Mount Rushmore.

Associate with men of good quality if you esteem your own reputation; for it is better to be alone than in bad company.

Born June 25, 1954 in NYC

- 1st Hispanic to serve as a U.S. Supreme Court Justice.
- Raised in housing projects and lost her father before she was 10.
- Inspired to pursue a career in law by the TV show Perry Mason, she graduated from Princeton and then Yale Law School.
- Provided pro bono (free) legal counsel to agencies devoted to public service.
- 66 Until we get equality in education, we won't have an equal society.





**Born** Nov. 7, 1867 in Poland | **Died** 1934

- Pioneering physicist and chemist in the field of radioactivity.
- Studied at the Sorbonne but had little money for food, sometimes fainting from hunger.
- Disproved ancient assumption that atoms were indivisible, leading to the creation of atomic physics.
- 1st woman to win a Nobel Prize & the only woman to win two!



**Born** July 2, 1908 in MD | **Died** 1993

- 1st African American to serve as justice on U.S. Supreme Court.
- After law school, he began a long affiliation with the NAACP.

To protest against injustice is the foundation of all our American democracy.






**Born** Aug. 5, 1930 in OH | **Died** 2012


- Astronaut, engineer and 1st person to walk on the Moon.

**Born** June 12, 1929 in Germany **Died** 1945


- Author & diarist known for her perseverance and strength during the Holocaust.

- Today she runs her foundation on the principles of tolerance & respect for others.

Racism is a grown-up disease and we must stop using our children to spread it.




Born Jan. 4, 1809 in France

- Access to communication in the widest sense is access to knowledge.






Born July 12, 1997 in Pakistan
