
Born May 27, 1923 in Germany Died 2023


- US Secretary of State from 1973 to 1977 and previously head of the National Security Council.
- In 1938, his family immigrated to the US in an attempt to escape Nazi persecution.
- 1973 Nobel Peace Prize winner.
- Do the most important thing you can think of doing every year & then your career will take care of itself."



Born February 24, 1942 in CT Died 2024


- 1st Jewish American to be nominated to a major party ticket, as Al Gore's VP in 2000.
- CT Attorney General before serving 24 years in the U.S. Senate, he helped create the Department of Homeland Security.
- A man of deep integrity and ethics, his commitment to Israel and his faith was evidenced by several books he authored.





Born March 15, 1933 in NY, NY **Died** 2020

- 1st female Jewish Supreme Court justice, appointed by President Bill Clinton in 1993.
- Popular for her strong dissenting opinions, especially about civil and womens' rights.
- Upset she did not have a bat mitzvah because of Orthodox restrictions on women reading from the Torah.
- Won 5 cases before the Supreme Court as law professor at Rutgers then leader of the ACLU.



Born Nov. 11, 1940 in NY, NY

- Senator from CA and 1st female to chair the Senate committee on Environment and Public Works.
- A proud Jew who dedicated her whole life to politics and liberal causes.
- Awarded Honorary Doctor of Law degrees from Mills College and the Dominican University of CA.



Born Nov. 13, 1856 in KY **Died** 1941

- The 1st Jewish Supreme Court Justice, he's known for improving privacy rights and free speech.
- Exposed the corruption within the Ballinger-Pinchot Affair.
- Earned the highest GPA in Harvard Law School history, & had a university named after him!

Born Feb. 14, 1942 in Boston


- Billionaire entrepreneur who cofounded his eponymous global financial information, software and media enterprise.
- A 3 term Mayor of New York
 City and global philanthropist
 who pushed for and funded
 environmental causes, education
 reform, public health initiatives and
 the arts.
- 1st recipient of the Genesis Prize, aka the Jewish Nobel Prize, which honors living Jewish individuals who have attained international renown.



Born Oct. 14, 1939 in NY, NY **Died** 2023

- Legendary fashion designer whose signature all-American style combined sporty, country club and the wild west.
- All of the menswear in the 1974 version of The Great Gatsby were designed by him.
- Won the CFDA Members' Salute, Legion of Honour and Menswear Return Award.






Born July 27, 1922 in CT **Died** 2023


- Revolutionary screenwriter and producer who brilliantly used humor to address racism and anti-semitism.
- He introduced edgy social and political themes into his all-time classics All in the Family, Sanford and Son, One Day At A Time and The Jeffersons.
- Member of the TV Academy Hall of Fame who won 6 Emmys & 2 Peabody Awards, he was also a veteran of the US Air Force.





Born April 4, 1932 in NY, NY

- Music industry mogul and founder of Arista Records, he's a known advocate for artists' freedom of expression.
- Graduated NYU & Harvard Law School before signing stars like Simon & Garfunkel, Aerosmith, Billy Joel & Pink Floyd while at Columbia Records.
- A Songwriters Hall of Fame member, he made household names of Aretha Franklin, Barry Manilow, The Grateful Dead and Whitney Houston, to name a few!



Born August 21, 1973 in Russia & March 26, 1973 in Michigan

- Computer scientists and entrepreneurs who met at Stanford University.
- They famously co-founded the search engine Google in a garage and each now has an estimated net worth over \$100 billion!
- They also dominate other industries like online video with YouTube and mobile computing with Android.



Born December 18, 1946 in OH

- Academy Award-winning director, screenwriter & producer of blockbusters like E.T., Jaws, The Color Purple & Jurassic Park.

- Rejected from film school but became the most commercially successful film director in history.

I don't dream at night, I dream at day, I dream all day; I'm dreaming for a living."




Born June 8, 1933 in NY **Died** 2014

- A pioneering woman comedian, known for her blunt personality, strong New York accent & multiple plastic surgeries!
- Regular guest host of many shows, especially The Tonight Show, she was inducted into the TV Academy Hall of Fame.
- Wrote several autobiographies, self-help and comedy books.


I wish I had a twin, so I could know what I'd look like without plastic surgery!"





Born August 25, 1918 in MA Died 1990

- World class conductor, composer, educator, author & pianist who's won dozens of awards & is in the American Theatre Hall of Fame.
- West Side Story is regarded as his greatest composition and he was the youngest conductor ever of the New York Philharmonic.
- Also conducted the Israel Philharmonic - before Israel was even founded, when it was known as the Palestine Symphony Orchestra - for 25 seasons!




Born Oct. 13, 1941 in NJ & Nov. 5, 1941 in NY

- Folk rock duo & 7 time Grammy Award winners who are in the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.
- Influenced by their Jewish values and identity, they originally called themselves Tom & Jerry and went on to record many #1 singles, including, "The Sound of Silence," "The Boxer" & "Bridge Over Troubled Water."
- "Mrs. Robinson" was a key song on The Graduate soundtrack.



Born December 1, 1945 in HI


- Singer, actress, comedian & author who is referred to as "The Divine Miss M."
- Her many chart-topping hits include "Wind Beneath My Wings," "The Rose" & "From a Distance."
- Also an accomplished actor in films such as Beaches, Hocus Pocus & The Stepford Wives.
- Multiple Golden Globe, Grammy, Emmy & Tony award winner, and Kennedy Center Honor recipient!



Born October 2, 1890 in NY, NY Died 1977

- Comedian, actor, writer & singer who performed in film, television, radio, stage & even vaudeville!
- With brothers Chico, Harpo & Zeppo, his films included Monkey Business, Duck Soup, A Night at the Opera & Horse Feathers.
- Also the quick-witted host of the game show You Bet Your Life.

Born Nov. 30, 1935 in NY, NY


- Award-winning writer, filmmaker, director & actor who has produced over 50 movies!
- Best known for Annie Hall but also acclaimed films Manhattan, Zelig, The Purple Rose of Cairo, & Crimes and Misdemeanors.
- Gifted writer and storyteller about the silliness of personal relationships and human nature.
- Also an author and musician, he played jazz clarinet with the Preservation Hall Jazz Band.



Born February 9, 1942 in NY, NY

- Talented singer-songwriter who burst onto the scene at just 17 with, "Will You Love Me Tomorrow?"
- With songwriting husband Gerry Goffin, she sold over 75 million records & had hits like "You've Got a Friend" & "You Make Me Feel (Like a Natural Woman)."
- Her love of music came from her grandmother, who survived the pogroms in Russia.
- "Tapestry" won the 1972 Album of the Year Grammy.





Born July 26, 1928 in NY, NY **Died** 1999

- Influential director who used innovative techniques in his dark and edgy but acclaimed films A Clockwork Orange, The Shining & Eyes Wide Shut.
- 2001: A Space Odyssey was his science fiction masterpiece and earned him 13 Academy Award nominations!
- His high IQ allowed him to become a master chess player, and BAFTA renamed the Britannia Award in his honor.



Born March 14, 1948 in NY, NY


- Actor, comedian & filmmaker who starred in cult classics When Harry Met Sally & The Princess Bride.
- Won a Tony Award for his one man play, 700 Sundays, about the times he spent with his father.
- Author of the popular children's book I Already Know I Love You.
- 9 time host of the Oscars, he attributed his humor and gift of storytelling from being Jewish.

SANDY KOUFAX

Born Dec. 30, 1935 in NY, NY

- Hall of Fame pitcher who won 2 World Series with the Brooklyn Dodgers.
- 1st left-hander in 85 years with a perfect game, he won 5 NL ERA crowns and 3 Cy Youngs.
- Skipped Game 1 of the World Series because of Yom Kippur!

I became a good pitcher when I stopped trying to make them miss the ball and started trying to make them hit it."



Born February 19, 1950 in CA

- 9-time Olympic champion swimmer & 1st to earn 7 gold medals in a single Olympics!
- 1st Jewish recipient of the James E. Sullivan Award (given to the Amateur Athlete of the Year) & a 20th century top 100 athlete.



Born January 1, 1911 in NY, NY Died 1986

- Known as the "Hebrew Hammer," he was the 1st Jewish player elected to the MLB Hall of Fame.
- A natural slugger, he smashed 58 homers in 1938 and was a 2-time MVP and World Series champion with the Detroit Tigers.
- 1st MLB player to serve in the military, he would spend Yom Kippur at the synagogue rather than play!



Born Oct. 16, 1980 in New York

- A basketball champion at every level - 2-time NCAA winner at UCONN, 4-time champ with the Seattle Storm, and amazing 5-time USA gold medalist.
- Retired with the most wins in WNBA history.
- Became an Israeli citizen so she could play more basketball in Europe!
- Considers herself both Jewish and Christian (and celebrates both Christmas and Hanukkah).



Born Sep. 20, 1917 in NY, NY **Died** 2006_______

- Considered the greatest basketball coach of all time, he led the Boston Celtics to 9 NBA championships (and won 7 more as an executive).
- This fierce, cigar-chomping competitor endured prejudice as a Jew but broke down color barriers by drafting the 1st African-American player.
- He pioneered many facets of the game & also wrote 7 books about life, business, success & winning.



Born Sep. 30, 1928 in Romania Died 2016

- Writer, teacher and human rights activist whose book *Night* is based on his harrowing experience as a Nazi prisoner.
- 1986 Nobel Peace Prize winner "for being a messenger to mankind...of peace, atonement and dignity."
- National Jewish Book award winner for his book, Souls on Fire.

No human race is superior; no religious faith is inferior. All collective judgments are wrong. Only racists make them."



Born February 2, 1905 in Russia **Died** 1982

- Born Alisa Zinovyevna Rosenbau, she was a writer and philosopher who developed her own theory known as Objectivism.
- Best known for her 1957 awardwinning novel Atlas Shrugged, which blames the struggles of American business on too many government laws and regulations.
- Her personal philosophy favored the idea that we should be self-interested and that being altruistic is destructive.




Born Oct. 17, 1915 in NY, NY **Died** 2005

- Award-winning playwright & screenwriter whose works focused on the "common man."
- Famous plays include All My Sons, The Crucible & Death of a Salesman, based on his 1929 stock market crash experience.
- His screenplay for *The Misfits* starred Clark Gable and his famous wife Marilyn Monroe!

Born January 31, 1923 in NJ Died 2007

- Prominent novelist, journalist and filmmaker who helped launch the popular alternative publication The Village Voice, which ran for over 60 years!
- Also won 2 Pulitzer Prizes in fiction for The Executioner's Song and non-fiction for Armies of the Night.
- His service with the 112th Cavalry in the Philippines in WWII became the foundation for his work The Naked and the Dead.


Born July 4, 1927 in NY, NY **Died** 2018

- A prolific playwright, screenwriter & author who created over 50 works, including Barefoot in the Park, Biloxi Blues and Lost in Yonkers.
- His Tony Award-winning play The Odd Couple about 2 opposite, dysfunctional roommates may be his funniest!
- He also won a Pulitzer, Mark Twain Prize, Screen Writers Guild Award and 2 Emmys, and even had a Broadway theater named after him!

BARBARA WALTERS


Born Sep. 25, 1929 in Boston Died 2022

- Journalist, interviewer, producer and barrier-breaking pioneer in American network news.
- Co-anchor of the popular news program 20/20 and creator and co-host of *The View*, she's won 7 Emmys over a 50+ year career.
- Adept at interviewing celebrities like Richard Nixon, Yasir Arafat, Barack Obama and Fidel Castro.
- A good laugh makes any interview, or any conversation, so much better.



Born January 12, 1954 in NY, NY

- Broadcast journalist, media personality & shock jock who calls himself the "King of All Media."
- His behavior and content has led to several fines by the Federal Communications Commission, but he's still the highest-paid radio personality in the world!
- Author of Miss America and Private Parts, he has also produced and acted in movies, and judged competitors on the hit TV show America's Got Talent.





Born January 16, 1947 in NY, NY

- Award-winning, edgy radio host & author known for giving "tough love" advice to her audience.
- Her oftentimes direct, blunt and controversial views were driven by her conservative Jewish morals, values and ethics.
- Received a PhD in Physiology from Columbia University, and a Doctoral certificate in marriage, family & child counseling.
- My life is what a salmon must feel like... always going upstream, against the current."



Born Mar. 22, 1948 in Germany

- Broadcaster, anchor and White House correspondent who won the Edward R. Murrow Award for his coverage of the 9/11 attacks.
- Long-time host of The Situation Room, he was a previous correspondent for the Jerusalem Post, where he covered the American political landscape & Middle East.

Born Nov. 19, 1933 in NY, NY **Died** 2021

- Born Lawrence Zeiger to Orthodox Jews from Belarus, he hosted his self-titled TV program on CNN for 25 years.
- Known for his chutzpah, he conducted tens of thousands of interviews, with notable like Frank Sinatra, Margaret Thatcher & Paul McCartney.
- I remind myself...nothing I say this day will teach me anything. So if I'm going to learn, I must do it by listening."



Born Mar. 14, 1879 in Germany Died 1955


- Genius theoretical physicist who devised the theory of relativity (E = mc2).
- His research improved the understanding of space, time and gravity, plus advances in refrigeration, solar power and much, much more...
- The Nobel Prize winner in Physics, he was also a talented violinist whom Time called the "Person of the Century."

A person who never made a mistake, never tried anything new."



Born Nov. 9, 1934 in NY, NY **Died** 1996


- Astronomer, astrophysicist and cosmologist known for unique and sometimes controversial views on science, religion and politics.
- Pulitzer Prize winner for The Dragons of Eden, he also wrote the groundbreaking TV series Cosmos with wife Ann Druyan.
- Believed life existed on Mars and helped with missions there.
- Co-founder of the National Religious Partnership for the Environment, to advocate for better environmental protection.



Born April 5, 1949 in Ohio Died 1986

- Brilliant engineer who became the 1st Jewish American astronaut and 1st Jewish woman to go into space.
- As a mission specialist, she operated the Space Shuttle's robotic arm that she helped design and develop.
- Also an accomplished classical pianist, but was sadly one of the astronauts aboard the doomed Space Shuttle Challenger.
- Posthumously awarded the Congressional Space Medal of Honor.





Born December 11, 1879 in NC Died 1971

- Social activist who dedicated her life fighting injustices and racial inequality.
- 1st Jewish woman to lead a statewide women's movement, she established the North Carolina League of Women Voters in 1920.
- In the 1960s, she worked to integrate schools and fight segregation in the south.

It is so obvious that to treat people equally is the right thing to do."



Born March 6, 1926 in NY, NY

- Economist who served as The Chairman of Federal Reserve and the Board of Governors, where he was known for stable inflation and steady growth.
- Studied music at The Juilliard School before attending NYU and Columbia University.
- At only 5 years old, he could recite baseball batting averages.
