



Born Dec. 25, 1899 in NYC **Died** 1957


- One of the greatest movie stars of all time, he was in over 80 films & won an Oscar for his role in African Queen.
- Bullied as a child, he enlisted in the Navy before becoming an actor.
- Other famous films include Casablanca, The Maltese Falcon and The Caine Mutiny.
- Named top male film star of the 20th C. by the AFI.
- Ain't nothing a man can't do if he believes in himself.



Born Sep. 18, 1905 in Sweden Died 1990

- Glamorous, elusive actress who starred in silent and talking films.
- Dropped out of school to work, lost her father and moved to the US all in her teenage years.
- Awarded honorary lifetime Oscar after appearing in 28 films.
- Famously private, she was also a fashion icon and art lover who was worth over \$55 million when she died!

Every one of us lives this life just once; if we are honest, to live once is enough.



Born Jun. 10, 1922 in MN **Died** 1969


- Born Frances E. Gumm, she first performed at 2.5 years old!
- She was 16 when she played Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz.*
- Academy, Grammy and Emmyaward winning actress and singer who had a troubled personal life.
- One of her children is the famous actress Liza Minnelli!
- Always be a first-rate version of yourself, instead of a second-rate version of somebody else.



Born Aug. 29, 1915 in Sweden **Died** 1982

- Actress in over 50 movies, most notably Casablanca and Murder on the Orient Express.
- Lost both parents before she was a teenager.
- Won 3 Academy Awards, 2 Emmys and a Tony award.
- Is the mother of Italian actress Isabella Rossellini.

I was the shyest human ever invented but I had a lion inside me that wouldn't shut up!




Born May 7, 1901 in MT | **Died** 1961

- Schooled in England and Iowa before being cast in manly, rugged roles spanning the silent and talking film eras.

In Westerns you were permitted to kiss your horse but never your girl.



- Celebrated for her beauty, she became an animal welfare and rights activist when she retired.



Good judgment comes from experience, and a lot of that comes from bad judgment.




Born Apr. 3, 1922 in OH **Died** 2019

- A life-long animal rights activist.

Born Apr. 23, 1928 in CA **Died** 2014

- Talented child star who appeared in her first film at just 3 years old!
- During the Depression, President FDR said, "As long as our country has [her], we will be alright."
- Two time Ambassador and also a U.S. delegate to the United Nations.
- Credited with making it okay to openly discuss breast cancer.

Born Jan. 18, 1904 England | **Died** 1986

- Actor in 75+ films including The Philadelphia Story, Arsenic and Old Lace, North by Northwest and An Affair to Remember.

- Struggled with drug addiction and depression but became one of Hollywood's leading men, marrying 5 different times!


Born May 29, 1903 in London Died 2003



Born Oct. 23, 1925 in IA **Died** 2005


- Longtime host of The Tonight Show, he first performed as a ventriloquist and magician.

- Received multiple Emmys & the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
- His foundation continues to support worthy charitable causes.

Born Aug. 13, 1899 in London Died 1980

- The "Master of Suspense," he directed Psycho, Vertigo and many other TV and film thrillers
- Grew up in the same area where Jack the Ripper once roamed.
- Considered by many the greatest director in history, he strangely never won an Academy Award.
- Knighted by Queen Elizabeth II.






Born Jul. 21, 1899 in IL | Died 1961

- Adventure seeker who liked big game hunting, deep sea fishing and bullfighting in Spain.
- Pulitzer & Nobel Prize winner

- Cartoonist and creator of the comic strip Peanuts, which has been published in 75 countries and 21 different languages!

- Drew almost 18,000 comic strips over 50 years, winning many awards, including Emmys and the Congressional Gold Medal.

Born May 6, 1915 in WI | Died 1985

- Influential film and radio performer, writer and director.
- His masterpiece Citizen Kane was based on magnate William Randolph Hearst and earned 9 Oscar nominations.
- He lost both parents by the time he was 13 years old.
- His realistic War Of The Worlds radio performance convinced listeners there was an alien attack, causing public panic!
- Race hate isn't human nature; race hate is the abandonment of human nature.

ABBOTT & COSTELLO



Born 10/2/1897 and 3/6/1906 **Died** 1974 and 1959

- Wildly popular entertainers most famous for their hilarious "Who's on First" skit, performing it over 1,500 times.
- Began in vaudeville and burlesque tradition but had instant success in Hollywood, starting with their first film One Night in the Tropics.
- Promoted WWII war bonds on tour, raising over \$85 million!
- You never heard of a comedy team that didn't fight, did you?




Born 7/20/1919 and 5/29/1914 **Died** 2008 and 1986

- The New Zealand mountaineer and Nepali sherpa agreed not to divulge who actually stepped on the summit first, out of respect.



- He won 4 Emmys and 2 Golden Globes; she, an Academy Award.

- She was campus queen before becoming an award-winning actress with her own TV show.
- Their close on-screen chemistry produced a kiss considered the most passionate in film history!



Born 6/7/1917 and 3/16/1926 **Died** 1995 and 2017

- This comedian & nightclub singer starred together on TV, radio, stage and in film for a decade.

- The "sexy & slapstick" duo broke up but reconciled 20 years later.


Born 6/6/1890 and 1/18/1892 **Died** 1965 and 1957

- Brilliant comedy team with trademark black bowler hats who perfected a routine of futility, incompetence and disgust.

- "Tell me that again?" was their memorable skit that went around in circles of hysterical nonsense.
- There are 3 museums devoted to them!

DYNAMIC DUOS



Born 2/1/1901 and 11/5/1913 **Died** 1960 and 1967

- Iconic on-screen lovers who played the roles of Rhett Butler and Scarlett O'Hara in Gone with the Wind.
- The film won 8 Oscars, including Best Picture and Best Actress.
- Though known as the "King of Hollywood," she didn't particularly care for him off-screen!
- His immortal last line in GWTW was "Frankly my dear, I don't give a damn."

Born 6/11/1913 and 1/9/1934 **Died** 1970 and 2019

- Coach and quarterback of the Green Bay Packers, with 3 NFL & 2 Super Bowl championships.
- Initially doubting his QB's toughness and leadership ability, the coach ultimately called him "the smartest QB I ever saw."
- Both were inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- QB & his wife led the coach's cancer foundation for 44 years.



Born May 29, 1917 in MA | **Died** 1963

- 35th President of the United States and youngest elected to the office.
- Awarded a Navy and Marine Corps Medal for WWII heroism.
- He established the Peace Corps & inspired the race to the moon!
- Supported broad civil rights and the Civil Rights Act passed soon after his assassination.




Born Jan. 26, 1880 in AR **Died** 1964

- 5-star Army General in command of the Allied forces in the Pacific during WWII, and subsequent rebuilding of Japan after the war.
- Also served in WWI and the Korean War, until President Truman relieved him of his duties.
- Became chairman of Remington Rand after his military service.



Born Nov. 30, 1874 in UK **Died** 1965

- Inspirational British Prime Minister who helped lead the Allied forces to victory in WWII.
- One of the pillars of the Grand Alliance in WWII, along with Franklin D. Roosevelt and Joseph Stalin.
- Knighted by Queen Elizabeth Il and won the Nobel Prize for Literature.
- You have enemies? Good. That means you've stood up for something, sometime in your life.



Born Oct. 14, 1890 in TX **Died** 1969

- Nicknamed "Ike," this WWII general became the 34th President of the United States.
- As Supreme Commander, he led the Allied forces at D-Day, beginning the end of WWII.
- Founded NASA, signed the 1957 Civil Rights Act and promoted peace with Russian during the growing tension of the Cold War.

A people that values its privileges over its principles soon loses both.


Born Nov. 22, 1890 in France Died 1970

- French General who led the Free French resistance effort against Nazi Germany in WWII.
- Later, as France's President, he oversaw the Algerian War, national resurgence and détente with countries behind the "iron curtain."
- Was also taken as a POW for almost 3 years during WWI.


Born Nov. 25, 1914 in CA **Died** 1999

- Nicknamed "The Yankee Clipper" and "Joltin' Joe," he won 9 World Series titles and safely hit in a record 56 consecutive games.
- Once married to Marilyn Monroe and immortalized in the Paul Simon song Mrs. Robinson.
- Served in the Air Force during WWII, in the middle of his career!
- There is always some kid who may be seeing me for the first time. I owe him my best.




Born Aug. 21, 1936 in PA **Died** 1999

- One of the most dominant players in NBA history, he holds the record for most points scored in a single game (100)!
- "The Stilt" towered over others at 7'1" and was a Harlem Globetrotter before starring for the Warriors, Lakers and 76ers.
- Became an author, actor, and pitchman after his NBA career.
- Everything is habit-forming, so make sure what you do is what you want to be doing.



Born May 13, 1914 in AL **Died** 1981

- One of the greatest champions of all time, the "Brown Bomber" was boxing's world heavyweight champion from 1937-1949.
- He served in the same U.S. Army unit as Jackie Robinson.
- A national hero after his knockout of Germany's Max Schmeling, he had a pro hockey arena named after him and was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal.
- You need a lot of different types of people to make the world better.





Born May 31, 1943 in PA

- NY Jet quarterback who "guaranteed" upset victory over the heavily favored Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III.
- Nicknamed "Broadway Joe" for his magnetic, rockstar persona, he won many awards but retired early due to injuries.
- Became a notable product endorser (including wearing pantyhose!) and actor in movies and tv for years after.

Born Sep. 10, 1929 in PA **Died** 2016

- Legendary golfer with 62 PGA Tour victories, including 4 Masters and 7 total Major wins.
- "The King" served in the United States Coast Guard for 3 years.

His "Army" continues to champion his philanthropic spirit.

 Has a cool beverage named after him and was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom.



Born Apr. 7, 1915 in PA **Died** 1959

- With gardenia flowers in her hair, "Lady Day" was one of the best jazz singers of all time.

- Inducted into Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in 2000 by Diana Ross.


Born Sep. 29, 1907 in TX **Died** 1998

- Affectionately known as "The Singing Cowboy," he was a pioneer of country music who came to fame in the 1930s for his crooning style in film, TV and radio.

- He starred in almost 100 films and is enshrined in the Country Music Hall of Fame.

- With a career spanning over 50 years, he's seen as one of the greatest jazz artists of all time.
- Had a "royal" name for his fine manners and the classy way he carried himself.
- Won 12 Grammys and composed or recorded thousands of songs, including "Take the A Train."

Born Sep. 16, 1925 in MS **Died** 2015

- R&B genius whose music has been on 50+ movie soundtracks!
- "King of the Blues" had many hits, including "Three O'Clock Blues" and "The Thrill Is Gone."
- He averaged 300 shows a year for 30 years, including in prisons!
- His famed guitar was called "Lucille" and his favorite singer and influence was Frank Sinatra.

Born May 3, 1903 in WA **Died** 1977

- One of America's most popular entertainers, his song "White Christmas" is considered the most popular holiday song of all time.
- Radio, tv and movie star who had over 300 hit singles and won Best Actor Oscar for Going My Way.
- A holiday favorite, he also had a radio program for nearly 30 yrs.
- Listen a lot and talk less. You can't learn anything when you're talking.


Born Sep. 7, 1936 in TX **Died** 1959

- Short-lived, pioneering singer & songwriter who, with his band The Crickets, had huge hits like "That'll Be The Day" and "Peggy Sue."
- Was a major influence on The Beatles and Bob Dylan.
- Credited with several music innovations and inducted with the very 1st class into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.
- Death is very often referred to as a good career move.



Born Jan. 8, 1935 in MS **Died** 1977

- "The King" was the most popular musical & cultural icon of the 20th century, selling over 1 billion records worldwide.
- 18 of his songs hit #1, including "Hound Dog" and "All Shook Up."
- He recorded over 600 songs in several genres but didn't write any of his own music.
- Values are like fingerprints. Nobody's are the same, but you leave 'em all over everything you do.



Born Apr. 24, 1942 in NYC

- Singer, songwriter and actress who is the highest-selling female recording artist of all time!
- Only artist with at least 1 Oscar, Grammy, Emmy, Tony & Golden Globe.
- Recorded hit songs "The Way We Were" and "You Don't Bring Me Flowers" and films Funny Girl, Yentl and A Star is Born.
- A tremendous philanthropist, she received the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2015.
- Stay true to yourself. People respond to authenticity.

Born Jan. 19, 1943 in TX | Died 1970



- Successfully fulfilled the "space race" goal laid out by President Kennedy in 1961.




